Academic, sporting, cultural and leadership with service achievements are then researched, considered, and rated. Congratulations to our Proxime Accessit Emilie Jones and Dux Anna Yarrall.

The Proxime Accessit for 2020 is Emilie Jones.

In addition to being a Top Scholar this year, Emilie has been a Top Scholar every year since 2016 and has participated in the full range of academic extension opportunities such as ICAS Mathematics, English, and Science. She was awarded Honours Academic for NCEA Level One and NCEA Level Two.

Emilie is a Prefect, a Peer Support Leader, a Keri Reading Tutor, has been a Class Representative and supported Daffodil Day. University Scholarships

Ongratulations to the following Year 13 students who have been awarded scholarships to support them in their tertiary studies. These prestigious scholarships come with substantial financial awards and mentoring. This year an incredible total of more than \$520,000 was offered to Kerikeri High School students. This acknowledgement of the hard work and success of our students marks an excellent start to their tertiary studies, and we wish them all the best.

Victoria University of Wellington awarded Tyrone-Christopher O'Neill the Wellington Kahotea Scholarship which recognises exceptional students, with a value of \$35,000. It encourages applicants who have achieved exceptional academic results, or have achieved within the areas of culture, community involvement, leadership, or equity. The scholarship package includes full accommodation costs at a Victoria University of Wellington Hall of Residence in the first year.

Te Paewai o te Rangi: The University of Waikato Scholarship for Outstanding Academic Achievement, has been established to contribute to the university's vision of achieving excellence, distinctiveness, and international connectedness. Candidates must have achieved NCEA Level 2 with Excellence and must show exceptional leadership qualities and/or be actively involved in community initiatives. Jack Hodgson was awarded this scholarship valued at \$25,000.

This year over 1650 applications were submitted for the University of Auckland Top Achiever Scholarship from students throughout New Zealand. This scholarship recognises exceptional ability and outstanding achievements and offers \$20,000 to each of our recipients: Charlotte Gamble, Emilie Jones and Jeany Kim.

University of Otago Māori and Pacific Peoples' Entrance Scholarships were established to celebrate academic excellence and cultural diversity. These scholarships are intended to encourage the progression of Māori and indigenous Pacific peoples into tertiary study. There are several tiers of this scholarship, with \$14,000 each going to Olivia Bell, Luke Bijl, Jacky Edwards and K'Lee Going; \$18,000 to Ella Bijl and \$21,000 to Scarlett Murray.

The Waka Moana Scholarship from the University of Auckland is awarded to Māori and Pacific students from low socio-economic areas attending university for the first time. The Scholarship includes a guaranteed place in a hall of residence and will cover the costs of catered accommodation in a standard room, up to a value of \$15,000, and a laptop to keep. Minaia Corfield, Kateao Hohaia, Dacoda King and Manaia Webb were recipients this year.

University of Otago's Leaders of Tomorrow Entrance Scholarship was established to assist students who have demonstrated all-round ability and who exhibit leadership potential to attend the University of Otago. Helen Wasey, Anna Yarrall, Alice Taylor and Maddy Kathro received this scholarship to the value of between \$7,000 and \$16,000.

Faith Hohepa was awarded the University of Otago 150th Scholarship to the value of \$14,000. These scholarships provide for students who have demonstrated academic ability and show potential and motivation to succeed at university.

Auckland University of Technology (AUT) recognises student academic achievement, potential leadership ability and contribution to the school, community, or cultural pursuits. The Office of Māori Advancement provides accommodation scholarships to support Māori students residing in approved AUT accommodation to the value of \$6,500, which this year went to Madisyn Makara and Manaia Webb.

Sarah Traill was awarded the AUT Vice Chancellor's Significant Student

Scholarship of \$6,500. These are awarded to students demonstrating leadership through academic excellence and achievement at a high level in sporting, cultural pursuits, or community involvement. **Deanna Griffin** received the AUT Academic Excellence Scholarship, which is awarded to students demonstrating academic excellence, and has a value of \$6,500.

The University of Auckland Academic Potential Scholarship valued at \$6,000 and payable over three years was awarded to Aishlin Murphy, Myer Robb and Marika Upston

Leia Weeds received the Wellington Tangiwai Scholarship which celebrates academic excellence. Up to 600 scholarships are awarded annually, valued at \$5,000 each, which can be put towards accommodation costs at a Victoria University of Wellington hall of residence, or as a contribution towards first year living costs.

Waikato University's Ko Te Tangata School Leaver Scholarship is awarded primarily based on evidence of academic readiness at NCEA Level 2 and strong community spirit. **Elisha Alexander** and **Theo Pilapil** received this scholarship valued at \$5,000.

The Edward Connolly Faculty of Engineering Entry Level Undergraduate Scholarship was awarded to Elisha Alexander. The main purpose of the \$5,000 scholarship is to support students in their first year of university and to encourage excellence in the study of subjects in the Faculty of Engineering at the University of Auckland.

The University of Otago New Frontiers Excellence and Sustained Excellence Scholarships were established to recognise academic excellence in secondary school study. **Annie-Zell McLaren** was awarded this scholarship of \$4,500.

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


Mcademic

Nimish Singh won the **Education Perfect** Language World Championships and Gillian Toala finished 7th from more than 173,000 competitors. Kerikeri High School placed 1st in New Zealand for schools greater than 1000 students and 6th in the world for Spanish. Other commendable achievements were: (Emerald) Joe Howells, Cassidy Schuller, Kelly Wan; (Gold) Ellee Newman, Pippiana Voakes, Rooni Perera; (Silver) Sarah Blackman, Isla Robinson; (Bronze) Eshika Kumar, Kayla Muller, Gemma Griffiths, Ella Howells, Brodi Brljevich.

Our students also excelled in the **Australasian Language Competency Competition**. In Spanish: (High Distinction) Nimish Singh, Joe Howells, Nichole Tysoe, Victoria Walker; (Distinction) Nichole Tysoe, Emma Thomson, Victoria Walker, Joe Howells, Ella Parker, Gillian Toala; German: (High Distinction) Anika Green.

Joe Howell was announced as a "Young Legend" award winner at this year's "Beautiful Awards," celebrated via a virtual awards ceremony. Keep New Zealand Beautiful Awards recognise and acknowledge individuals, businesses, community groups, towns and cities who are working hard across Aotearoa to Keep New Zealand Beautiful.

Two Kerikeri High School students topped the world in the first international virtual reality language competition. Gillian Toala did not just beat 10,000 students in six countries to win the top prize in the ImmerseMe Games, she also won 1st place for Greek and Spanish. Nimish Singh placed 2nd worldwide and took out the prize for Mandarin Chinese.

The competition was based around virtual reality language learning software in which competitors were dropped into a series of pre-recorded virtual reality situations. They must test their language skills with real native speakers, by ordering a baguette in a Parisian boulangerie or booking into a hotel in Indonesia for example. Casey Roberts earned a Silver award and Lea Grundmann won a Bronze award. Kerikeri High School was awarded Top School based on average score.

Noah Crooks was recognised for his Outstanding Creative Editing on our school's ShowQuest piece, a prize which includes the opportunity for zoom mentoring by industry professional Shae Sterling.

Jade Sceats received a High Distinction for ICAS English this year, achieving in the top 1% of her year level.



Nimish Singh placed 2nd at Level 2 and Gilda Tejada won the Scholarship category in the STANZA National **Spanish Speech Competition.**

Year 7-8 Debaters competed in the Regional Intermediate Debating Tournament. They had great success, with two of the Year 8 teams winning every debate. They were supported by their committed coaches in Years 11 and 12, who also adjudicated at the competition.



Early this year Senior Debaters attended the Regional Selection Tournament at Huanui College. Stella Blackwood, Faith Hohepa and Charlie Potter were the runners-up at the tournament. Charlie Potter and Faith Hohepa were selected as members of the 2020 Northland Debating Team and Stella Blackwood was selected as reserve. All three students were to attend the National Schools Debating Competition in Wellington, however the competition had to be held online this year. Our Northland team won two debates and narrowly lost two debates in the challenging conditions.

The Kerikeri High School Speech
Competition was again of a very
high quality, with the Finalists having
to be very flexible due to several
postponements. Despite this, the
speeches were outstanding – possibly
because the speakers had to practise
them so many times! The speeches
proved to be a powerful way for the
students to process their feelings
about a very turbulent year: the topics
ranged from the pandemic to racism
and to the environment.

Casey Roberts was placed in the shortlisted top 4 in the New Zealand on Screen – Screen Test Short Film Competition and was our Director for the school's 2020 entry to Stage Challenge on Screen which placed in the top 5 in New Zealand.

Ten Kerikeri High School teams competed in the **Northland Mathex**. We had two placings, with a Year 8 team 3rd (Aela Breeze, Aria Lee, Paige Edwards, Nikita Underwood) and a Year 10 team 2nd (Jade Sceats, Joe Howells, Chase Elia, Charley Cates).

Six Kerikeri High School competitors worked with Barfoot and Thompson's Auctioneer Mr Ross Paterson, to learn the complex skills required to be a professional Auctioneer.

They competed in the **Regional Student Auctioneering Competition**, with Nimish Singh receiving \$1,000 for 1st place; Lydia Bailie-Bellew 2nd and Nicolas Powell 3rd both receiving \$200.

The Real Estate Institute of New Zealand watched the footage and invited all six participants to compete in the National Auctioneering Schools Championship which was won by Nicolas Powell.
The competition was at a very high level and Nicolas' performance was outstanding.

Three Kerikeri High School Geography students reached the top eight for final selection into the **New Zealand iGEO team**; Alexie Smith, Jamaine Young and Stella Blackwood. If they gain selection into the New Zealand team of four, they will travel to Istanbul, Turkey for the iGEO competition in 2021.



This year our students did particularly well at the Young Enterprise Scheme Regional Awards, with Leia Weeds and Olivia Bell receiving the Award for Excellence in Financial Management and Gina Baguley receiving the Award for Excellence in Tourism. The night

belonged to two Kerikeri High School students. Rosie Robinson was awarded five trophies: Excellence in Business Management, Excellence in Sales, Marketing and Communication, Excellence in Financial Management, Excellence in Sustainability and the BDO Young Managing Director of the Year. Rosie also placed 2nd in the region for the YES Company of the Year. Max Donaldson won a Trophy for commitment and was announced the Regional Winner of YES Company of the Year. Max will travel to Wellington to compete for the national title of YES Company of the Year.

GEOGRAPHY

s part of the Geography program, students Aparticipate in various field trips to reinforce their learning. These are an important part of Geography as it allows for the collection of evidence and enables students to see interactions and patterns that exist outside of the classroom.

Year 12 students experienced a Marine Reserve at the Poor Knights off the Tutukaka coast. This day trip included snorkelling, paddle boarding and kayaking around the Poor Knights Marine Reserve. Year 12 students also travelled to Paihia for the day to undertake research collection including surveys, counts, environmental surveys and sketch maps. Year 11 students researched the weather variations between Kerikeri High School and the Bay of Islands Airport.











YES Trade Fair

he Young Enterprise Trade Fair took place at Kerikeri's Packhouse Market after two postponements. Thirty-nine teams from around Northland attended, including 10 teams from Kerikeri High School. Business Enterprise

Twenty groups of Year 12 and 13 students took part in the Young Enterprise Scheme in which student businesses come up with a product they produce then sell. In term two, nearly 80 teams from Northland presented business pitches, after which the top eight were invited to redo their pitch to an audience and panel of judges at the mid-year celebration. Kerikeri High School had three teams in the top eight; Rosie Robinson (Snackish), Ally Sargent (Spill the Beans) and Max Donaldson (Green Kiwi).

The Business Card competition in which the top three teams win printed business cards was jointly won by Max Donaldson and Kayla Murray (Apple and Glaze) with Nikita Kingston and Kacey Powdrill (Bag It Up) third. Three of our companies placed in the top six of the Business Plan competition, which offers cash prizes to help offset start-up costs. Max Donaldson placed first, Leia Weeds and Olivia Bell (L&L Partnership) second and Rosie Arthur and Riley Bradcock (R&R Organisers) were fifth.





unior students volunteered for the Tradescantia Pest Management Project in term one. They adventured out to the Wairoa Stream to use an innovative tool and technique for collecting the shiny beetle species that are a key biocontrol organism. The shiny beetles were suctioned up into little containers and then transported in mini habitat boxes to native areas invaded by Tradescantia weed. This pest is a noxious South American weed commonly seen in our region. This project was started at Kerikeri High School by Mrs Leaming and a group of students known as the Tradescantia Terminators, to protect the local wairoa (long river) and ngahere (forest).












MATHEX

Kerikeri High School's Mathex had a strong sign up with 59 teams registered to compete. Mathex is an exciting, fast-paced night where teams of four students are presented with 20 tricky mathematical questions, with the aim of achieving a full score of 100 points. There is a twist in the competition; this is not a traditional sit down and write a test, nor is it an online 'choose the correct answer' test. Mathex not only requires quick team thinking and accurate calculations, it needs a team member who can run - fast!

The runner from each team first completes a sprint loop around the gym to collect the question, then returns to their table for the team to answer it and then runs back to the marker with the team's answer. The next question is not handed out until a correct answer is achieved. If the answer was wrong, the runner must go back to the team - so the teams are not only using their mental skills but also trying to beat the clock. It was a fun, action packed night of mathematics.

SSA Croquet was held in Kerikeri, teams playing five rounds and enjoying learning the intricacies of the sport of croquet. Our results were:






Kerikeri High School won the Burnsco Interschool Sailing Championships.

A team of 8 boys coached by Nate Te Hira came away with a very respectful 4th place at the NSSA Junior Boys Basketball competition in Whangārei.





The opportunity arose for us to run an after-school netball skills learning programme with ex-student Lisa Mather who is a current national premier league player. The popular sessions ran over four weeks in year level groups, with the players learning a lot and having a great time.

Our Hockey 1st XI mixed team saw the promotion of several players from the Kaikohe competition who stepped up and made a real impact in the team. We were seeded in Division 2 going through with 7 wins, 1 draw and 2 losses, placing 2nd overall. The team will lose three experienced players next year, Emily Lyall, Anna Yarrall and goalie Levi Poulgrain, and we wish them well.



Our Mountain Biking Team competed in Wellington at the **Championship** Mountain Biking event. We had some great results with Lily Wilson 3rd in both the downhill and Enduro for U20s and Tiree Robinson 4th in the U16 cross country. Our team came in 23rd out of the 103 schools competing.





Sky Gundry attended the Scholastic Surfing Nationals in Kaikoura, the pinnacle of junior surfing in New Zealand which is held at a different venue every year. Surfers must qualify to compete as part of 12 regional teams for the five-day event. Team Northland placed 4th and Sky placed 6th in the U18 Girls division.

Logan Denize competed at the Rotorua Schools Motocross Challenge in the very competitive 15-19 age group 125cc, placing 1st overall. Logan also raced at Tauranga in the Schools Motocross Challenge, placing 3rd for Kerikeri High School. Jacky Edwards competed in the Spearfishing national competition at Little Barrier Island, achieving two 2nd placings and 1st in the Junior Women's division.

At the Swimming Northland annual prizegiving, Emilia Finer was awarded the title of Swimming Northland's Fastest Female in multiple events. She was also awarded the Mick Parr Memorial Trophy for Services to Swimming and Open Water Swimmer of the Year.

The National Age Group Championship is an event for 13-18-year-old swimmers in which New Zealand's best age group swimmers compete for national honours. Kori Brown (Y12), Emilia Finer (Y12), Ariella Ripohau (Y10) and Florence Venner (Y9) qualified to attend this championship event. The New Zealand Division II Championship is for up and coming

The New Zealand Short Course Championship is our pinnacle open age national event. Kori Brown, Emilia Finer, Ariella Ripohau, Florence Venner and Mia Le Roux (Y8) attended this event. They competed in age group finals, with all swimmers improving their Personal Best times, moving up national placings and qualifying for 2021 National Age Group events. Emilia Finer and Florence Venner placed 3rd and 2nd respectively in the 200m Butterfly in their age groups.

In the NZSS Swimming Championship, the best athletes compete in age groups and must qualify for all but the 50m events. Six of our swimmers qualified and they were outstanding representatives for Kerikeri High School: Kori Brown, Henry Ludbrook, Emilia Finer, Sophie Broughton; Ariella Ripohau and Florence Venner. Their results included top 8 places, personal best times and many achieved qualifying times for the 2021 NAGs and DIV II competitions.



Gateway is a work experience programme where mature and work ready senior students are encouraged to work one day a week, for a minimum of 6 weeks. In 2020 we placed 117 students within 141 roles with 58 different employers.

Students who undertake Gateway, are working in real workplaces, gaining work experience, and building skills for employment. They are expected to earn 20 credits while on Gateway and to aid them, they complete Unit Standards throughout the year. We also put on First Aid and Health and Safety courses in the school holidays to avoid disrupting curriculum time. Where possible, we organise units of work from the Industry Training Organisations that are usually assessed by workplace or industry assessors.

This year we hosted an outside provider who ran the very successful Learners
Driver's License courses assisted by the local police and heavily subsidised by the

Ministry of Social Development. We have had 100% success with students learning the road code, then being supported to sit their Learners test.

We have students doing work experience in a range of pathways including Engineering, Building, Primary Teaching, Hairdressing, Barista, Vet Nursing, Gas Fitting, Roofing, Agricultural Contracting and Retail. Many students gain part-time paid employment or even apprenticeships from their Gateway employers, and gain skills they can add to their CV as well as references from employers.

Five of our Gateway students left school during the year with apprenticeships or trials in building, with another ready to begin a barbering apprenticeship. Students have gained part-time work with their Gateway employers or gained work due to their placement. The Prime Ministers' Vocational Excellence Award is in its second year of running, and this year, Bryan-Junior Murray-Davis was awarded the \$2,000 cash prize and is now working full time in the building industry.

Board of Trtustees Report 2020

eflecting on 2020 is interesting to say the least! We live now in a Refast paced and ever changing world, and although this year has turned out to be a very different one to what we'd all expected at the start, let's focus today on the positives, because there is always good to be found.

We welcomed a new parent trustee this year; Haylee Rhodes has joined the Board and also the Finance Committee. Our thanks to Fintan McGlinchey who resigned earlier this year. Last year we welcomed the Education Review Office (ERO) at the end of term 3 and we were delighted with their final report in early December. Their overall evaluation noted that the school's "performance in achieving valued outcomes for our students is strong". Even more so that this rating of "Strong" is the third in a row over a period of 10 or so years. Until changes announced by the Ministry this year, ERO have reported on schools less often where such a high rating is achieved.

Each year at this time our report in the school magazine highlights events that the Board has participated in. They have always included Matariki celebrations and our Kapa Haka Roopu performance at the Tai Tokerau Festival. While we have not been able to enjoy them this year, we have 2021 to look forward to, and we have great memories of the events from 2019 and earlier. The Board also always acknowledges all our sports, debating, business, science and culinary teams competing locally and around the country. Many of them were also affected but the school was proactive in organising replacement activities whenever possible.

Our NCEA results show that our school continues to exceed the national measures. Our students have achieved success at the highest levels in all the four cornerstones (sporting, cultural, leadership and academic) and have held our WAKA values close. We were also delighted with the Scholarship results and acknowledge the teachers who put a lot of extra time in with these students.

Our Property Committee have continued to keep the school in top condition. It speaks volumes for the work they have done, when a visiting official from the Ministry of Education was given a guided tour of the school recently. They were very impressed how our classrooms have been built to work and adapt so well for teachers and students. Sadly our year has ended with some unexpected rebuilding work for the Committee after the BES fire. Heading into Christmas there will be some long-awaited work completed on the bus bay.

Our Finance Committee were grateful to have made the decision late last year to accept the Government's contribution in lieu of parent

donations. Without that we would have struggled financially through the year with the impact of Covid-19. Heading into 2021 we are expecting to have slightly larger classes but are working as hard as we can to ensure there is minimal impact on the students' options in and out of - the classroom.

Our International Department are hopeful that we will be able to take students in again from around the world. They are an important part of both our school and our community, and the Department worked tirelessly to get most of the students home in March with extremely short notice. With only a handful of international students until the borders eventually reopen, the school has ensured continuity of the international staff team and they have been relocated throughout the school to work in other departments.
