## KEEP OURSELVES SAFE

As many of you will be aware from recent media coverage, the school worked closely with the Kerikeri Police in 2016 to deal with a person in our community who was selling marijuana to young people, including some of our students. This person made marijuana readily available in our community. We are extremely vigilant and do everything in our power to make our School a safe a place for our students and staff.

We are hopeful that the imprisonment of this drug dealer sends a strong message to everyone that Kerikeri High School will not tolerate drugs in or around our school. While this matter was investigated by the Police, and was subsequently in the court process, we were unable to make any public comment.

We did run a series of Assemblies as this situation unfolded explaining to students the risks marijuana causes the adolescent brain, and we explained in the strongest terms the school's position on drugs and what happens to students caught involved or associated with drugs in our School. We will remain vigilant and do everything we can to keep our school safe, and we continue to encourage our students to make safe decisions.

## MICROSOFT OFFICE 365 AND STUDENT EMAIL ACCOUNTS

Kerikeri High School has established Microsoft Office 365 accounts for all of our students. These allow all Kerikeri High School students a school email address, as well as cloud storage via One Drive and access to Microsoft Office Web Apps via Office Online.

All students are also able to download and install a full version of Microsoft Office on up to five different devices, including computers, tablets and iPads through the Microsoft Student Advantage programme.

Having a school email address and Office 365 account means that students have access to a range of online tools to support their learning anytime, anywhere.

## 2017 BEGINS WITH THE FUNDAMENTALS OF CARING

## LUNCHES

Students can buy their lunches from the Tuckshop where an extensive daily menu is offered. The Tuckshop is open before school, at intervals and at lunchtimes. There are special arrangements for lunches to be ordered and delivered for Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 students at the beginning of their lunchtime. Lunches should be ordered and paid for before school.

Students will not be given permission to leave school grounds during school hours to buy lunch in town regardless of whether or not they have a note from home. Permission to attend appointments in town during school hours must be applied for at the Student Centre and an appropriate chit will be issued.

## THE SCHOOL CONTRIBUTION AND ACCOUNTS

An account for every student has been posted home. This will include the School Contribution and also Subject Fees for some subjects where there is a "take-home" component to cover the cost of materials that are provided by the school. We realise that there are many expenses at the beginning of the year with stationery, school uniforms and camps, and we will be pleased to arrange for accounts to be paid over a period of time. Automatic Bank Payments are encouraged. Please contact Reception to ask for the forms to start up a regular direct credit to Kerikeri High School that will cover your family's expenses in easy payments throughout the year.

The voluntary School Contribution is very important to the school. This contribution can be claimed as a donation for tax purposes. The School Contribution is used to pay the huge number of extra services and activities at this School for which we receive no Government funds.

## ST JOHNS CENTRE

A sick or injured student at school must report to the St John Centre or to Reception for their safety. In the best interests of the students' safety we will only release a student to go home unwell from school once a parent or caregiver has been contacted. We need accurate records in the event of an emergency, so it is really important that the school is informed of:

- **Change of address/circumstances**
- **Change of telephone numbers (work or home)**

## EDUCATION OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM

We do run an extensive Education Outside the Classroom programme that includes everything from routine field work to after school sailing, camps, tramps and weekend sports events. Permission for routine and low risk activities is given on enrolment and we will contact parents for permission for each major or higher risk EOTC event before it occurs.

## SUN PROTECTION

We encourage all students to wear hats and sunblock when outdoors.

## PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION

The Parent Teacher Association meets monthly and all parents/caregivers are encouraged and welcome. The meetings are advised in the School Newsletter.

## KERIKERI HIGH SCHOOL BUS BAY

The Bus Bay at the front of Kerikeri High School only just accomodates the buses for the High School and Primary School. Even one single car parked there at bus times means that buses are left blocking Hone Heke Road. Please keep clear as directed by the signs between 8.00am and 10.00am in the morning and between 2.00pm and 4.00pm in the afternoon.

## DON'T FORGET – PLEASE KEEP TURNING LEFT

Traffic congestion in Hone Heke Road is a major concern – please remember the “Left Turn Only” rule between the hours of 8.15am – 9.00am and 2.45pm – 3.45pm. This rule covers the area from Oripiro Road past the entrance to the Kerikeri High School Tennis Courts and Community Swimming Pool.

## SMOKE FREE ENVIRONS ACT REMINDER

We have always adopted a “smoke-free” environment at Kerikeri High School ever since the 1970s and we would like to remind parents and community users of the school that our entire campus is smoke-free. We absolutely require your cooperation in this.

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## School Bus Information

The main school bus service in the Kerikeri schools area is provided by the Ministry of Education, through their service agent Multiserve, to assist eligible students to travel from their home to school. Funding provided is managed by the Kerikeri Schools Transport Network (KSTN) who contract Clarks Coachlines to provide the service. Clarks Coachlines provide us with an extremely efficient service, with a modern well maintained and impeccably presented fleet of buses.

**For a student to be eligible** for School Transport Allowance, students *from Years 1-8* must live more than 3.2km from the School they attend, for students *from Years 9 or over* must live more than 4.8km from the school they attend. Each school is surrounded by a Transport Entitlement Zone which is defined by the mid-point between the school and the next similar school. Note that the Transport Entitlement Zone is not necessarily the same as the School's enrolment zone, and in fact is different for Kerikeri High School in both the Haruru Falls and Takou areas.

**Eligible students living within the Transport Entitlement Zone** will usually be able to use a bus service near them. However the Ministry of Education reserve the right to provide a transport assistance allowance in lieu of a bus if it is uneconomic to operate a bus for a few students. This is currently the case in the Purerua peninsula area. Note that students are expected by the Ministry of Education to walk up to 2.4km to their bus stop, so routes usually do not extend to the Transport Entitlement Zone boundaries.

**Eligible students who live outside the school's Transport Entitlement Zone** are still entitled to some assistance. They may be transported from the Transport Entitlement Zone boundary to the school on a KSTN bus or they may be approved to receive the **Transport allowance**. Application forms for a transport allowance are available from Reception and need to be returned to the school. After verification they are forwarded to Multiserve who determine whether they are accepted. Allowances are paid to caregivers each term in arrears.

**Caregivers should apply for the transport allowance in Term One** to ensure the full annual allowance is received. Once approved the allowance remains active until the student leaves school or changes their address. Even if remaining eligible a new application must be made for a new address.

Most routes have comfortable loadings, although we have not quite been able to meet our desired policy of having all students seated. However no bus has been overloaded, and all drivers have strict instruction to not ever exceed the legal loadings. Most buses are licenced to carry around 20 standing student passengers.

Loading the large number of students efficiently and safely onto buses at the end of the day is a challenge. The twenty buses will not all fit in the bus bay so they arrive at set staggered times. As the first buses move out the next wave of buses arrives. If even a single car is parked in the Bus Bay the process is considerably slower, leaving buses on Hone Heke Road unable to enter the Bay and blocking all road traffic. Please do not park in the Bay between the times displayed on the signs. Registration numbers of cars impeding the buses are passed on to the Police and tickets have been issued in the past.

Where space is available, for example after offloading students at Riverview, the KSTN allows non-eligible student passengers for a small fare, currently \$1 per ride within the 4.8 km area, and \$2 outside that.

This service is very limited and not guaranteed, as the eligible user numbers vary day-by-day, and is not available if these additional students significantly increase the number of standing passengers. All fares collected are used to improve the service.

Occasionally in the past students have used the KSTN service to travel to the Waipapa sports grounds for training. Unfortunately because of loadings no space is available on any bus serving Waipapa so this service is no longer available for casual passengers.

All queries regarding the bus services need to be made to the student's school. The contractors are not able to make decisions about routes, or casual passengers.

In addition to the KSTN bus service, there are Clarks Coachline buses serving the Paihia, Opuia and Kaikohe areas, and Stewarts serving Kaeo. All these are fare-paying services, but students using them may be eligible for transport allowance and caregivers should make application for this allowance.

**From the Kerikeri High Schools' Transport Network**



Dear parents and caregivers of year7 students,

From 2017 there will be changes to the HPV vaccination schedule, it will now include boys. The vaccine has been improved and now only 2 vaccinations are required.

Positive changes to the HPV vaccine now mean that your son/daughter will be protected against 9 strains of the HPV virus that cause cancer,

Why boys now? Funding is available in NZ to include boys in the HPV vaccination programme. By vaccinating boys and girls we are protecting women from cervical cancer as well as men and women from other HPV related cancers.

Why vaccinate for HPV in year 8? At this age a child's immune system takes up the vaccine more effectively. At this age boys and girls are generally not sexually active and the vaccine is best given before they become sexually active.

Vaccinate Before They Need Protection.
