Kia ora koutou Parents, Whānau, Students and Staff

This term has been extraordinary. We have never faced the amount of ongoing illness across the School community as we have seen in the last few weeks. The ongoing impact of this has been significant regarding continuity of learning and for Seniors especially in regard to their assessments. We are especially aware of the impact this has on our Year 13 students who are now in their third year of NCEA during the Covid pandemic.

In 2020 and 2021 the disruption caused by Covid was predictable and evenly felt because lockdowns were national and/or regional, and we all faced the same circumstances. This year the impact is greater because of the ongoing uncertainty, ongoing illness and ongoing absences. You will not be surprised to hear that student attendance has dropped significantly across the school this term. Teachers have been impacted too, and on our worst day, just last week, we had 31 teachers away from School. Our decision to roster some Year Levels home a day has meant we have been able to continue to keep the School open.

We are very mindful of the wellbeing of our students under these circumstances, and we are doing everything we can to manage and care for our students and staff. Our priority is kindness, and we are working hard to strike that difficult balance between catching students up who have been away, keeping the classroom learning ongoing and meaningful for those who are here, and managing assessments so that students feel ready and prepared as best they can.

Our relieving staff have been fantastic, and we are fortunate and grateful to be so well served by them.

The good news is that despite the uncertainty and disruption, the School is extremely settled, our students remain positive and they continue to be engaged in the many opportunities available to them here at School. We are very proud of them. Kia Manawanui.
