This is our final Newsletter for 2024. I want to thank everyone in our school community for all the contributions made to Kerikeri High School throughout what has been a very busy and successful year. Our hard-working staff, our students and our student leaders across the year levels, our parents who help with coaching, managing, supporting and transporting students, and the community organisations we interact with on a regular basis – ngā mihi nui to you all.

Every school year is busy, and this one has been no exception. To add to the complexity, in 2024 we have also faced significant changes, namely the new NCEA Level One requirements, new assessments for Literacy and Numeracy, the nationally mandated 'Phones Away for the Day', new attendance reporting requirements, and an hour a day of reading, writing and mathematics for students in Years 7 and 8.

Overwhelmingly we have absorbed and adapted to these changes successfully and maintained our focus on the important things that keep our school strong and moving forward – our teaching programmes and student learning, WAKA, the Four Cornerstones and our commitment to Te Tiriti, and always striving to be a genuinely bi-cultural school where all our students can feel comfortable in both Te Ao Māori and Te Ao Pākehā.

Our students have worked hard and achieved a lot throughout 2024. Our regular Year Level Assemblies, our academic and our Four Cornerstones results, our Elite Senior Prizegiving, and our Junior Prizegivings are evidence of that. There's a lot to be proud of and celebrate.

Last week we warmly welcomed students from Te Whakatupuranga, Kerikeri Primary School, into our school community with pōwhiri and a symbolic handing over (photos on cover). We are looking forward to welcoming all our new students into our school in the first week of February next year and making sure they have a wonderful start to their time with us.

On the following page I've covered a few points parents and whānau may be interested in for 2025. We will continue to move the school forward, lift the bar and improve; we are already working hard as we plan and organise for what's ahead next year. Before then though, there is the summer and Christmas break to enjoy. 2025

School Uniform in 2025. We saw a marked improvement in students wearing correct school uniform in 2024, and I have no doubt that this has contributed to an improved orderly and settled environment at school. Thankyou parents and whānau for supporting our students to be in the right uniform every day.

In 2025 we will continue our focus on school uniform, and we will be especially vigilant about skirt lengths, which remain too short, and correct school shoes. Please support us by ensuring your child has correct and full school uniform that fits. If there are financial circumstances that make that challenging, please reach out to your child's Year Level Dean confidentially and we may be able to assist.

There will also be a new school jacket available for students next year which is more modern, waterproof and will help keep them warm on our colder days.

Attendance in 2025. School attendance continues to remain a concern, and there are still too many students whose school attendance does not meet the levels required to be considered 'regular', which is above 90% a term. In 2025 we will be taking school attendance into account when we are offering opportunities to participate in Four Cornerstone activities, such as sport, and we will likely have an attendance requirement that students in Year 11, 12 and 13 will have to meet to be able to attend the School Ball. These requirements will not be onerous, but they will need to be met. Every day at school counts and is important for student learning and achievement.

Parent Portal. In early 2025 we will release details about our Parent Portal which will allow parents real time access to your children's attendance, school reports, Four Cornerstones records, achievement and NCEA results and your school financial accounts. You will also be able to review your contact details. I know a lot of parents will welcome this step forward.

Our New School Website. I've been talking about this for some time now, and was perhaps overly ambitious about how quickly we would get his launched, however we have made significant progress, and we will be launching our new look website in early 2025.

Chewing Gum in 2025. We will also be very clear with students that chewing gum must not be brought to school or chewed at school. It has become a major issue with chewing gum being dropped on carpets, concrete and stuck under chairs and desks.
