Principal's Message

Kia ora koutou

The positive and bright start for Term 3 has been overshadowed by the very sad passing of one of our Kerikeri High School staff members, and former student, Mrs Rachel Cameron. Rachel's brave health battle came to an end on Wednesday last week, and our school whānau is mourning. Our thoughts and aroha are with the Cameron, Armstrong, Webb and Kingi whānau, and everyone in the wider community who has been affected by this sad news.

Our School Ball was held at the end of the first week of Term and it was fantastic night; themed as Narnia (photos on cover and video link in Newsletter), and an outstanding success once again. Our wider school community comes together to provide this opportunity for our students in a range of ways, from helping with hair, nails and makeup, ball gowns and suits, hosting alcohol free pre-Balls and the opportunities to take those special group and family photos, dropping students off in style in a range of vehicles, and assisting our outstanding PTA with the incredible supper. Our students were outstanding throughout the evening, enjoying a great night, and acting respectfully and appropriately. I was so impressed, and our staff greatly appreciated the genuine thanks so many students gave us as they left the Auditorium.

I want to make a special mention and thanks to our Year 13 Dean Mrs Jessica Lowe and our Assistant Principal Miss Dana Boisen who led the Ball Committee in planning, organising and setting up the Ball. They were supported by a number of staff members, including Year 11 Dean Mr Paul Boardman, and Year 12 Dean Mrs Roz Clent, and a dedicated and very hard-working group of Year 12 and 13 students on the Ball Committee. The work that went in over the school holiday break to set the Ball up was extensive.

I want to also acknowledge the PTA and make special mention of long serving members Mrs Karen Grenside and Mrs Shelley Ellicott who have given years of service to the PTA and the Ball supper organisation. Thank you, Karen and Shelly, for all you have done for Kerikeri High School. And ngā mihi nui to everyone for all the mahi that went in to make the Ball so special.

When I initially prepared my comments for this Newsletter the situation with staff sickness and illness was not as significant as it has subsequently become. Rostering students home this week is the last thing I wanted to be doing, however the levels of staff absence due to sickness, and the variable availability of our dedicated Relief Teachers has meant we are operating beyond capacity to keep all our classes running. My hope is that the rostering home will be a circuit breaker that gives us some breathing space. I want to acknowledge how hard our teachers are working and thank them for stepping in to cover for absent colleagues so often.

We have deliberately not rostered home our Year 7 and 8 students as we are aware of the impact their supervision would have on parents' work commitments; we have also avoided rostering home Year 11, who have a heavy assessment schedule currently in the new Level One NCEA environment.

Thank you everyone for your understanding, this is a difficult situation to navigate, and we hope that we can return to business as usual very quickly.

eDNA Testing

A group of Kerikeri High School Year 13 students became forensic detectives earlier this year. sampling the Wairoa Stream and Kerikeri River for eDNA. Just like criminals leave DNA at the site of a crime, organisms living in or alongside the Wairoa Stream shed DNA into the waterway. The environmental DNA (eDNA) collected can be analysed and matched to a library of DNA to identify what organisms are present. Native species deemed to be at risk were detected including, kāeo (freshwater mussels), torrent fish and tuna (long finned eels). An invasive species, Gambusia (mosquito fish) was also detected. The students would like to thank Kerikeri Rotary members for helping fund several eDNA kits.



Year 11 Life and Environment Science

Last month Life and Environment Science students worked with Rod Brown and Friends of the Wairoa Stream, helping to plant over 400 riparian plant species along the Te Tahawai Stream situated at the end of Mill Lane. The aim is to restore the mauri of this tributary of the Wairoa Stream. The students were accompanied by Environmental Engineer Jonathan Cousins from Vision Consulting Engineers and Sunny Perry (Year 13). The students received instruction on taking soil core samples and assisted in taking water samples of

both the Te Tahawai and Wairoa streams for sediment analysis back in the classroom. Students would like to thank Vision Consulting Engineers, Sunny Perry and Friends of the Wairoa stream for this learning opportunity.





Year 13 Drama Performance
