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### Principal's Message

#### Kia ora koutou

This is our final Newsletter before the school holidays begin, and I want to take the opportunity to wish all our students and staff my best wishes for a safe and refreshing break. Term 3 has been extremely busy across the school with so many successful major events including the Senior Ball, Science Fair, Music and Drama performances, a large number of winter sports including Tournament Week and AIMS Games participation, trips to the Hillary Outdoor Pursuits Centre, and on Steinlager 2 with The New Zealand Sailing Trust, various Drama and Musical productions and Performances, and Young Enterprise Scheme Market Days just to mention a few. #### **Our Recent School Lockdown**

Unfortunately for the second time this year we were recently forced into a schoolwide lockdown. I have already shared details of what led to each of those situations, and I appreciate all the positive feedback we had regarding how we managed and communicated about those difficult moments. Thank you for your support.

In the rare times we face such circumstances, our processes include doing our very best to communicate with our school community as much as possible about what is going on. Initially we endeavour to notify parents and whanau via our school app, and via email. Often, we may not have sufficient information available to notify you with details, but you can be assured we will be doing everything to keep our students and staff safe.

We subsequently notify everyone as soon as possible when the lockdown is lifted, which typically requires Police advice to do so. Again, we may not be in a position to share details with you when we send that notification. We do and will continue to do our best to share with you as much detail as we can as soon as we can following any lockdown situation.

While a school is in lockdown, it is usually not possible to answer phones. Nor are we allowed to let anyone except Police come into the school. I want to thank our school community for responding so positively to our efforts to keep everyone safe two weeks ago. Our students responded calmly, swifty and without fuss, and our staff were outstanding in gathering everyone up and looking after them. And we received a lot of very positive and grateful feedback from parents both for the process we followed and of the care we took.

Special acknowledgment of the staff members who put themselves in harm's way and talked down some very angry and aggressive young people.
