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Principal's Message

Kia ora koutou

A very warm welcome back to everyone as we begin Term 4. This is a relatively short Term for our students in Years 11, 12 and 13, with our Elite Senior Prizegiving ceremony on Friday next week (1 November), and NCEA examinations beginning on Tuesday 5 November. Between now and then there is a lot of opportunity for students to be preparing and revising for those important examinations. In addition, we will be offering a number of short courses of teaching, followed by assessments, for students who need extra opportunities to gain the Achievement Standard credits they need to achieve at Levels One, Two or Three. There is more about information about our Short Course programme in this newsletter.

Our students in Years 9 and 10 will sit our internal school examinations in Weeks 5 and 6 of this term, 13 November – 19 November. They will not be on examination leave during this time. These examinations are important for our younger students. They are an opportunity for them to learn how to prepare and revise, and an opportunity to work out their most effective preparation strategies, as well as learning to manage the requirements of a written examination. We are urging all our students in Years 9 and 10 to take these examinations seriously and to put time and effort into their preparation.

We were thrilled and proud to award 35 senior students Elite Kerikeri High School Honours Awards across the Leadership with Service, Sporting and Cultural Cornerstones last week. The first criteria all senior elite achievers must meet is that they are good role models, and our recipients this year most certainly are. Their diverse and outstanding achievements were deserving of our acknowledgement, and the hard work, commitment and sacrifice that led to these accomplishments provide great examples for other students to emulate.

Our Elite Senior Prizegiving on Friday 1 November at 11.30am will once again be a highlight of the school year as we come together to acknowledge and celebrate the exceptional performance and achievement of so many of our Year 11, 12 and 13 students across the Four Cornerstones, and most especially the Academic Cornerstone. We extend a warm invitation to all parents, whānau, caregivers and friends of the School to this special occasion. Because Senior Prizegiving involves all our staff, normal classes will not run that day for students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10, and students in those year levels who come to school that day will be supervised by our relief teachers.

The working group, called 'Te Püherenga' has been creating a range of teaching and learning resources for all kura, kaiako, ākonga, whānau and hapu.

We are holding a Kerikeri-wide whānau hui at Whitiora Marae at 5.30pm on Thursday 14 November. The kaupapa of this hui is to share the mahi from the Te Püherenga initiative and also to have a korero with whanau to develop a shared vision for education in our community. Dr Lisa Watson (Ngāpuhi and Ngātiwai) from the University of Auckland and Mrs Jane Jarman, from Kerikeri High School will facilitate the hui.
